Introduction to Growing Tea (Camellia sinensis)

Plan before planting:

Site and soils

- Zone 7 or higher, or protection from cold, with 30-50% shade morning shade (winter)
- Well-drained and acidic soils (pH 5.5-6.5) test your soils first if possible, or lower pH slowly if plants already in the ground.

Planting

Choose your plants

- var sinensis in temperate climates (some cold hardy) vs. var assamica (subtropical)
- Clones of selected plants (shallower root system), or seedlings (tap root, more variety)
- Seeds are easy to start keep moist, OK indoors or outside in spring/summer shade

Prepare a site, 3 to 4 square feet per plant

- Create raised bed 6-12 inches if drainage is poor, add compost, pea gravel
- Hole almost as deep as the pot and twice as wide, surrounded by loose soil
- Prune tall single stems (at 6-10 inches) on transplanting or in the winter.

Patience (and care)

Tea requires 3 to 5 years before it becomes productive for tea

- Weed control avoid disturbing shallow roots
- Fertilizer to promote healthy roots and vigorous growth
- Formation pruning to encourage branching
 - o Dormant plants can be cut in the winter
- A few of the common pests we see in tea
 - o Aphids Tea scale
 - O Voles, deer (but tea is one of the last things they choose)

Growing in pots (short term or long-term)

- Tea is not a houseplant!
- Soils and pots
 - o Ground aged pine, compost (7:1), camellia/azalea mix
 - o Can add 10% perlite (increases drainage) or 10% peat moss (holds water).
- Water every 2-3 days, let it dry out between waterings
- Transplant yearly to slightly larger pot (start small)
- In winter: Short-term indoors (e.g., protect the roots from freezing) In summer: Optimize sun/shade, watering
