Our Speakers

Linda Franzo has been the owner and cooking / garden instructor of Passionate Platter, located in Slidell, La. for 20 years. Linda is married to her husband, Rick Franzo and has 3 married sons, 3 Daughters in "Love" and 8 grandchildren. She is a retired Speech Communication Specialist. Along the way, she attended several cooking schools around the country, CIA, St. Helena, NECI, Vermont, Boulder Cooking School of the Rockies, focusing on bread making & brick oven cooking. Her hobby turned into a new passion & career. At Passionate Platter, Linda provides Herban Garden tours and cooking classes for kids and adults. Linda's classes are presented Garden to Table style, seasonally influenced. Classes are by appointment only because she travels around the country presenting Herb cooking classes to groups as small as 8 to 200 plus. Linda is the cooking instructor at The Kitchen Table in Hattiesburg, Miss. Linda has retired as Chair of The New Orleans Herb Society. She is an advanced master gardener of St. Tammany parish who designed & currently maintains the Herb Garden at the Slidell Library. When she is not in the garden or cooking, she is a New Orleans Tour guide and a yoga instructor, loves to bike ride & kayak. Linda wants everyone to get hooked on Herbal Inspirations.

Jason Powell is a co-owner of Petals from the Past Nursery in Jemison, Alabama. Jason earned degrees in Horticulture and Landscape Design from Auburn University and Texas A&M University. He and his wife Shelley have spent their careers developing Petals from the Past into the full-service nursey and gift shop that it is today. The nursery specializes in antique roses, heirloom shrubs, cottage perennials and herbs as well as classical varieties of vegetables and fruits. Much of what is grown at the nursery is integrated into a garden setting. Petals from the Past approaches gardening from an educational standpoint and hosts lectures, workshops and guest speakers in its educational facility. Major events such as "Antiques in the Garden" and the 'Black and Blueberry Festival' are just a few of activities that make Petals from the Past a destination in central Alabama.

Dr. Arlie Powell is a co-owner of Petals from the Past Nursery where he shares his extensive knowledge and expertise in fruit culture. Arlie has served as an Extension Horticulturist at the land-grant universities of Texas A&M, the University of Georgia and Auburn University. He was the fruit specialist at Auburn University from 1978 – 2002 after which he became the Associate Dean for Extension and the College of Agriculture. Arlie has authored or co-authored over 200 publications, including scientific papers, bulletins, books and numerous articles. He is a much sought after speaker and has shared his expertise at meetings and conferences around the United States. He has served as a horticultural consultant in Central America and Mexico. Dr. Powell continues his commitment to Auburn University as Professor Emeritus and by serving on graduate student committees.

Debbie Boutelier is a life-long lover of all aspects of gardening and nature. Her interest in herbs and other edibles began in the early 80's when she planted her first edible garden with vegetables and culinary herbs. Her interest rapidly grew into a vocation spanning the many different aspects of using herbs in everyday life and incorporating organic techniques in everything she grows. As an Air Force wife, she has lived in different areas of the country and broadened her gardening knowledge with each new assignment. Upon moving to Alabama in 1994, Debbie pursued her interest in herbs and gardening on a full-time basis, taking the Alabama Master Gardener course in 1995. She has given over 13,000 hours of volunteer service to the Master Gardener program and received the Advanced Master Gardener designation in 2018. Her involvement with the Master Gardener program led her into a new career as a County Extension Agent in Autauga County for 8 years. Debbie now teaches nationally and presents seminars and workshops on the many aspects of herbs, organic gardening, nutrition, and other garden related topics. She has studied the medicinal uses of herbs for over 15 years and completed a three year intensive study of the medicinal aspect of herbs at the Appalachian Center of Natural Health. Debbie's herb passion has led to the creation of her small cottage herb business, Rooted in Thyme Apothecary. Debbie is a long-time member and past president of the Herb Society of America. She has appeared on "The Time of Your Life" (local NBC affiliate) and on Troy Public Radio.

Jemison, which was incorporated in 1907, is located at the geological end of the Appalachian Mountain Range near the very center of the state. Jemison was incorporated to honor Colonel Robert Jemison, Jr., one of the foremost developers of the early state of Alabama.
